Start: Church Field Car Park, A39, Camelford, PL32 9TB. FREE PARKING what3words – skinning.stormed.episodes

Please arrive at the start no later than **1.30pm** to sign on as directed and meet fellow participants. First car will leave at 2.00pm.

Public Toilets - walk out of the car turn right and keep right to Enfield Park, WCs on left .

All entrants must sign on as this is an MSUK recognized Touring Assembly event. There is no charge for taking part in this event or a need to be a member of the organizing club to participate.

Please note the finish venue will not be open until 4.00pm and will close at 6.00pm

There are various places of interest to visit, toilets and refreshments on the route. Some will require payment if you wish to park etc.

The route will take in the north coast of Cornwall and includes a very scenic drive that is both narrow, twisty and steep in places. There is an alternative route to avoid this section if preferred.

The finish venue will provide light refreshments for cash donations to be given to the charity chosen by our hosts.

If you require more substantial food or drink there are opportunities to purchase these from venues enroute.

There should be time in the scheduled route to stop to explore places of interest, enjoy the view etc.

Tailpiece

So there I am in the 2CV trundling up the A30 at a sedate 60mph, grandson sitting beside me, I commented to him that the engine wasn't sounding right but as needs be we push on regardless, well until just before the Trewint turn off there was a loud bang and complete loss of power, fortunately we roll in to Trewint and decide that what ever it is there is no choice but phone Viv's recovery services (this is a bit of a standing joke in our house), OK she says (trying not to sound too excited) be with you soon.

In the meantime a car pulls up beside me (partially blocking the road, well it is Trewint) driver gets out and exclaims "wonderful car" and proceeds to me all about his family and how they had eight Citroen's at one time, after a long chat he takes off to do the family shopping (not in a Citroen), recovery service arrives and we are towed home.

Once I am allotted some garage time a quick compression test reveals zilch, no compression, no choice but to get the spanners out. Short term remedy is that I have fitted a slightly tired but running engine which means we are at least mobile again, hey ho.
